He also loved vintage gospel music. Eulis was an amateur avid fisherman, not knowing a lot about fishing but he tried. He was always the first to say let's go fishing. His gear was always packed. He was also a collector of miniature cars, military memorabilia (Buffalo Soldiers), and miniature tools. Eulis was devoted to his family and friends. In 1995, he met his soon-to-be devoted and dutiful wife, Dora Saunders and they were married March 20th, 1996. He was a great husband, dad, and provider to his family. Eulis had a unique quality about him because he would go shopping with his wife never leaving her side. No matter how many stores

Dora went to, he was there. He is survived by his loving and devoted wife, Dora Saunders; one daughter, Jannine Saunders; cousins; special friends, Quinton Manson and Charles Schmitt, and many other. Eulis' dad, Eulis Sr. predeceased him 13 days before his death.
